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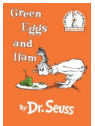
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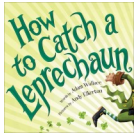
# March

## Go Green!



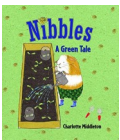
### Week of March 4

We will read *And Then It's Spring* by Julie Fogliano, learn the rhyme “Little Chick Waits,” and make a baby bird in a nest craft.



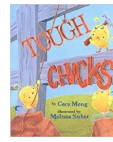
### Week of April 8

We will read *Tough Chicks* by CeCe Ming, learn the finger rhyme “Ten Little Chicks,” and paint a chick using a shower sponge.

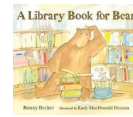


### Week of April 29
